Texas History Month



Texas History Month is celebrated during March and features key dates such as Texas Independence Day (March 2) and the anniversary of the Battle of the Alamo (March 6). It is a time to celebrate our state's rich history, proudly wave the Texas flag, and take pride in calling Texas home. At Texas Star, we honor the historical events and legendary Texans who helped shape our great state both on the course and throughout the clubhouse.

Many of our golf holes pay tribute to Texas history and folklore. Hole 3, "High Mesa", Hole 9, "Devil's Point", and Hole 12, "Bugle Ridge", inspired by the rugged terrain of West and Central Texas landscapes that shaped early travel and settlements. Hole 15, "Battle Cry" and Hole 18, "Degüello" reference military bugle calls and symbols associated with the Texas Revolution, particularly the Battle of the Alamo. The "Degüello" was a Mexican Army bugle call played during the 1836 Siege of the Alamo.

The Treaty Room is named in honor of the 10 Indian tribes who agreed to a peace treaty with Sam Houston on March 31, 1843. The public art located on the front lawn of the clubhouse depicts the signing that took place on the Trinity River, just a few miles from Texas Star.

Even our pin flag is similar to the Texas State Flag. We didn't want to show any disrespect to the flag, so we inverted the red and white, and our logo replaces the Lone Star. So, come out for a small history lesson while you enjoy a lovely Texas spring day on the course!

Tips From the ProDan Walden

Time To Move

As we move into spring with the usual ups and downs of cooler temperatures, now is the perfect time to loosen up and prepare your body for golf season. Take advantage of these simple exercise routines to improve flexibility, stability, and swing speed.

- ◆ Mobility & Flexibility (Daily)
- ◆ Thoracic Rotations – 2 × 10 each side
- ◆ Hip Flexor Stretch – 20–30 seconds per side
- ◆ Hamstring Stretch – 20–30 seconds
- ◆ Shoulder Circles / Arm Swings – 10–15 repetitions
- ◆ Core Stability (2–3 times per week)
- ◆ Chair Squats – 2–3 × 8–12 repetitions
- ◆ Single-Leg Stand – 20–30 seconds per side (use a wall for balance if needed)
- ◆ Heel-to-Toe Walk – 10–15 steps
- ◆ Optional Power & Speed
- ◆ Resistance Band Rotations – 2 × 6–8 per side

Focus on smooth, controlled movements not maximum effort.

Member Tip: These exercises are designed to support increased speed, flexibility, and overall swing performance. Incorporating just a few of these exercises each day can help improve flexibility and add speed to your golf swing. Give them a try and see how you feel out on the course!



Red Ball Event Recap – February 8th

We had a smaller-than-usual participation in the 2026 RED BALL MGA Golf Event, our first event of the 2026 season. Thank you to everyone who was able to join us!

The format consisted of four-player teams. On each hole, one designated player played a RED ball from the RED tee box, while the other three players scrambled for a second score. The RED ball score and the scramble score were combined for the team's total on each hole.

If a team managed to keep the RED ball in play for all 18 holes without losing it, they would receive a two-stroke bonus off their total score. However, no team was able to hold onto the RED ball for the entire round; every team lost it at some point during play.

The scoring was extremely close, with two teams tying for 1st place at a total score of 128. Four teams tied for 3rd through 7th place with scores of 130 and 132, respectively.

Superintendent's Soapbox...

Spring Is Coming!

Other than one week of extremely severe cold and ice, this winter has overall been great for golf and other outdoor activities. I'm sure we will experience a few more frosty mornings and maybe even another cold snap or two, but as far out as the forecast can be even remotely accurate, it looks like spring is definitely on its way.

Even though this time of year can make it difficult to plan your wardrobe more than a day in advance and can definitely throw a kink in the maintenance crew's day-to-day activities it has little bearing on our seasonal duties and course preparations. Those will continue according to the calendar as usual.

Our spring preparations for the growing season will include:

- ◆ Application of pre-emergent weed control throughout the entire course to combat summer weed infestations.
- ◆ The first application of fertilizer to give the turf a boost during green-up and encourage growth to help withstand the increased traffic of tournament season.
- ◆ Mowing of native areas across the course to promote desirable species and eliminate small trees and brush beginning to emerge.
- ◆ Gradually lowering mowing heights and grooming the greens as aggressive growth begins, improving consistency and roll.

As a reminder regarding our new TifEagle greens, no aggressive aerification or major maintenance will be performed until later in the summer, when growth rates are at their peak and healing time is shortest.

As always, thank you in advance for your cooperation and understanding of these necessary maintenance tasks. Please know they are performed with you in mind to minimize disruption while maintaining the highest quality conditions possible.

We hope to see you out on the course soon, to enjoying the beautiful spring weather arriving here at Texas Star.
